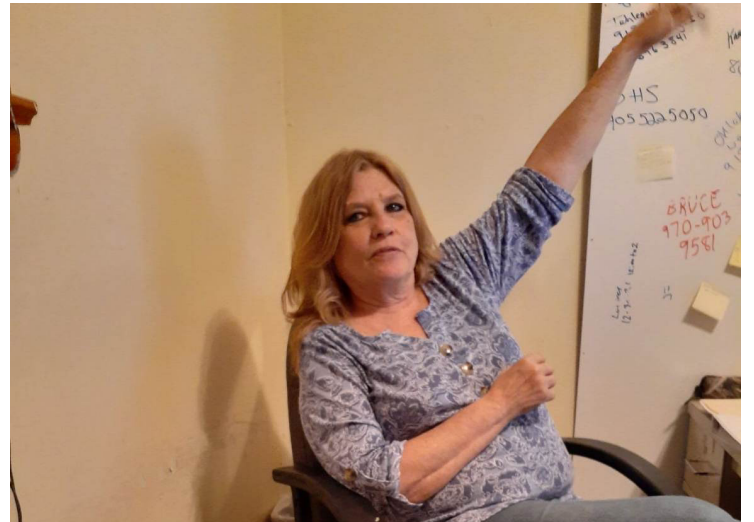

The building is in need of extensive repair. The stay was provisional with the caveat being repairs must be made or else the building comes down. The time given for this huge project is limited. The funds to complete are even more limited. Yet Shelly knows that God is not limited and that Romans 8:28 says, "Everything works together for good, for those who love God and are the called according to His purpose." God's purpose for Shelly and Feed My Sheep is to fight the battle of redemption for lost souls. Shelly Terrell is fully equipped to be the Street Warrior Woman who girds up everyday for the battle. And ultimately, the battle belongs to the Lord.

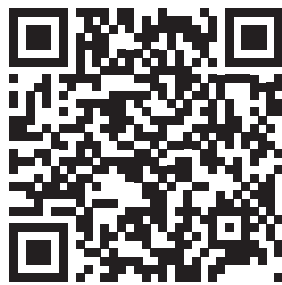


