#### **Indians Ramble Over Rangers: 34-19**

The Stilwell Indians put their foot on the gas in the first half and never let up. Yet, the game did not start that way. Roland took the kickoff on their own 35 and started marching down the field reeling off chunks of yardage with one running play after another, up the middle and off tackle, all the way down to the Stilwell 10 yard line. Then, for some odd reason, Roland decided to put the ball into the air? It was intercepted, one of 5 turnovers by the Rangers in the first half, by Dustin Noisewater at the goal line and returned to the Stilwell 17. It did not take the Indians long to cash in. At 2:31, Stilwell put the pedal to the metal as Trey Chuculate rambled 45 yards for the first TD of the 2023 seasson. The extra point made it 7-0 Indians. With an 11 yard pass from Juan Martinez to Chuculate, the Indians were once again on

the board; the extra point gave Stiwell a 14-0 lead at 11:12 of the second quarter. Again, the opportunistic Indian defense gave the offense great field position with a fumble recovery at Roland's 40. Stilwell made good on this turnover with a 44 yard TD pass and an extra point. At 9:11, the scoreboard read: Stilwell 21 Roland 0. With 18 seconds left in the half, the defense came up with their second interception at the Roland 44. With the clock showing 3 seconds left, Juan Martinez hit Oren Shelley with a nifty 45 yarder to make the halftime score: Stilwell 27 Roland 0. As often happens with a large halftime lead, the foot comes off the gas and the opponent feels like they can back into the game. Indeed, Stilwell's first half intensity seemed to have abated, although the outcome of the game was never in doubt. Stil-

well put up one more TD; Roland scored 3 times with the last one coming with just 3 seconds left. Although Stilwell played well on both sides of the ball, the Indians have some work to do. The entire game was marred by personal foul and unsportsmanlike conduct penalties on the Indians. One of those penalties negated Freshman OB Brandon Carter's TD pass, his first pass of his Stilwell High School career. It was a quick slant perfectly thrown with nothing but green turf ahead for the receiver. It was called back. Unless this problem is effectively remedied, potential victories against tougher opponents will easily slip through Stilwell's fingers. The class 3A Keys Cougars come to town Sept. 8. Kickoff at 7 pm.




