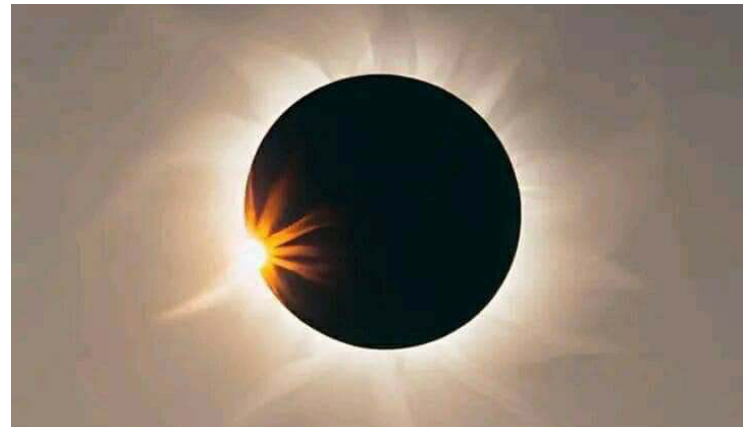

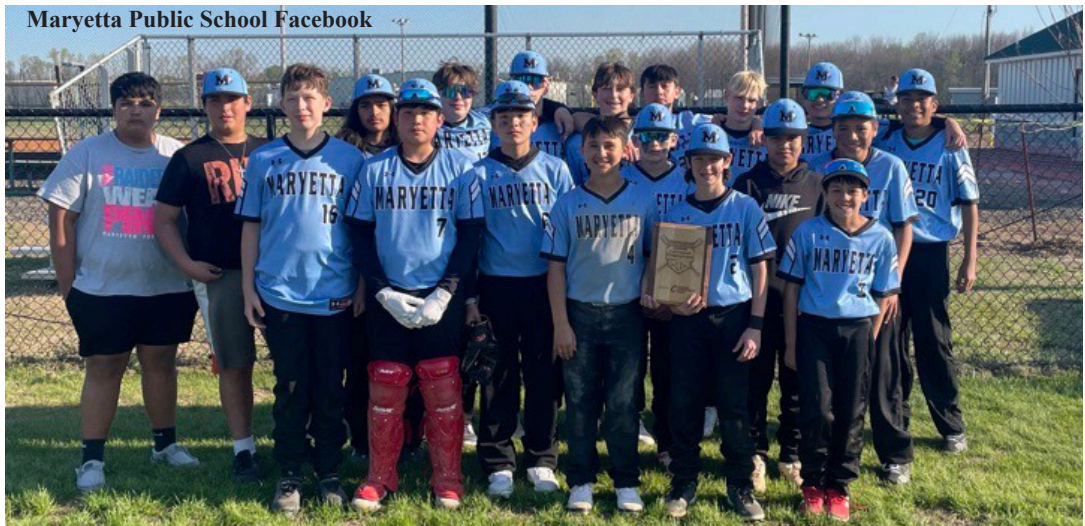

us hope that this twenty two will tip the Biden canoe.

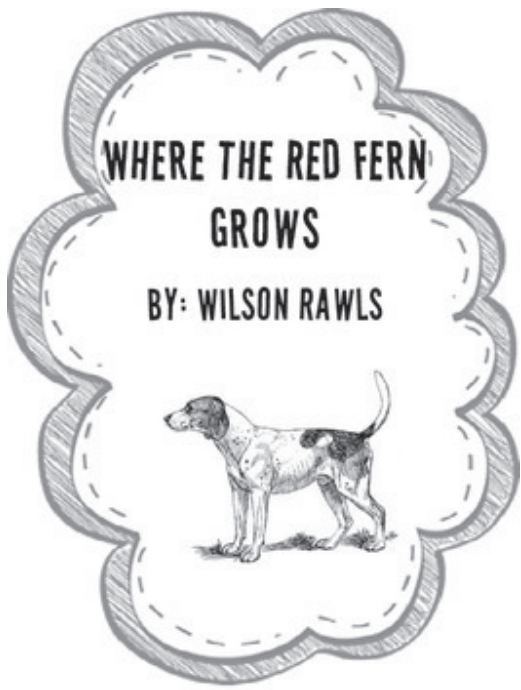
