After winning their first two games at home in impressive fashion against two 3A opponents, Roland and Keys, the Stilwell Indians took a long bus ride south to tangle with the 3A Stigler Jaguars. Stigler boasted a 2-0 record and were ranked 6th in the State. It goes without saying that this opponent would give the Indians a run for their money. The first half was all Stigler. With a ferocious pass rush, QB Juan Martinez spent the entire half running for his life with no time to pass. The run game also stalled. Meanwhile, the Jaguars put points on the board using the power running of their tailback. The Indians displayed a certain lackluster performance on both sides of the ball. 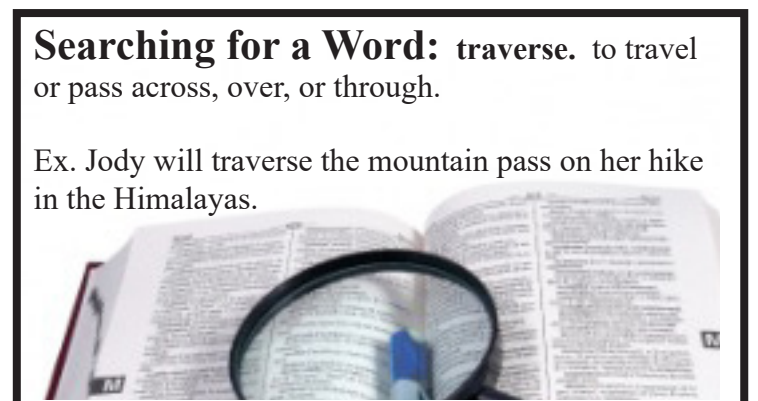

It had disappeared from the gym floor a few years back. Today it is on the activity bus, gym floor and the school

sign. It is his legacy of giving something to the school. The school honoring that and who most of the students are. No, it is not a mascot! As some will probably protest in ignorance if they found out. As one person who saw it for the first time said "look it is Joe's ndn. Legacy: in Luke 12:16-21 it talks about a rich man who had so much he built more barns and was fully satisfied. He was going to live a life of leisure... but God said "fool this night your soul is required of you; then whose, will these things be?" Great Chiefs and warriors have come and gone as well as statesman. Their legacy remains but what about yours? Again, the question of what will you pass along or give to others? 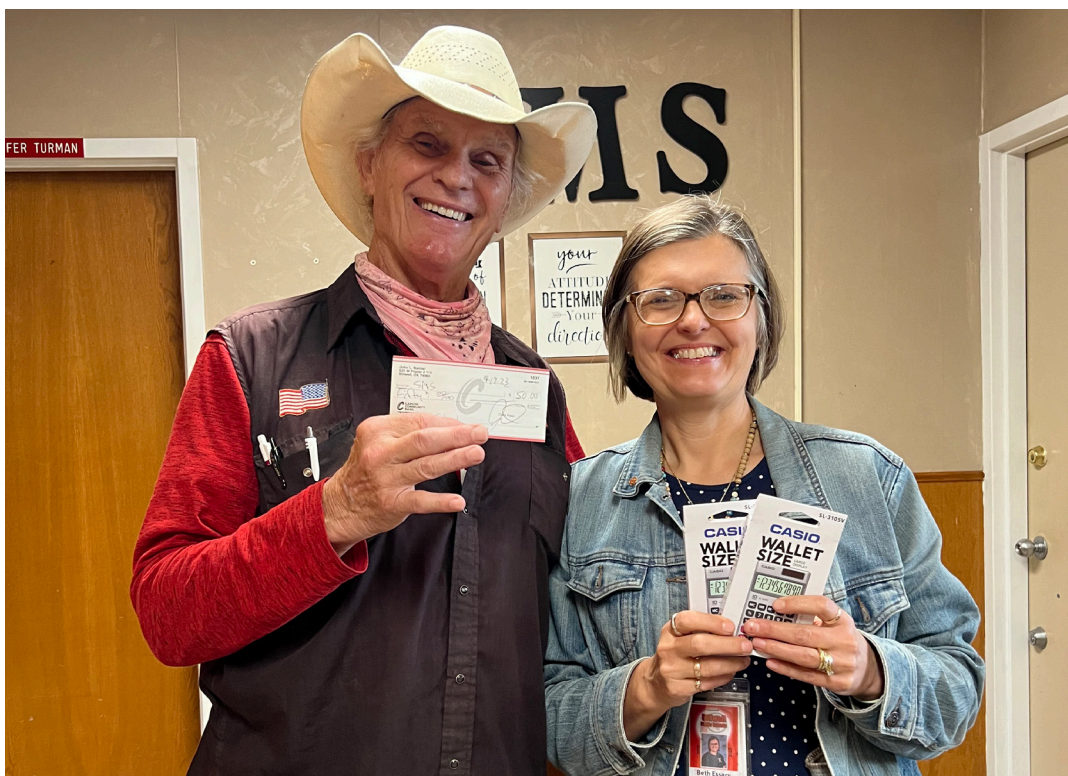
Constitution Alive! facilitator, Jack Ogden
