Stilwell Chamber Of Commerce Inducts New Officers

The Stilwell Chamber of Commerce meets regularly on the first Thursday of the month. The December meeting was held at Rowans Restaurant in the cozy confines of the fireplace room. The Cherokee Nation provided a sumptuous lunch prepared by the Rowans Restaurant kitchen. Outgoing President Teresa "Tracy" Sims, under whose direction much has been accomplished, presided over the swearing in of the new, 2023, officers and members of the Board of Directors. (See accompanying photo for who is who). Chuck Hoskin Jr, Cherokee Nation Chief, was the featured speaker. He spoke about the construction of a 13 million dollar wellness center and the long term impact that this facility will have on the health and well-being of the Nation's citizens. The wellness center will focus on nutrition and fitness

which are the key to the prevention of illness. He talked about the enormous positive economic impact that a healthier nation will bring. Hoskin also emphasized the language preservation program that is underway with the opening of "immersion schools" one of which is slated to open at the Greasy Community Center. An opening ceremony will have been scheduled for December 3. His vision is to someday have someone, who is around 5 or 6 years old now, become Chief and be able to address the people in fluent Cherokee, which he said, with some lament in his voice, he is not able to do. At the end of his address, The Chief received a vigorous applause. The next Chamber meeting will be January 6, 2023 starting at Noon at a location to be announced.

Oklahoma Class 4A Football Season Ends With Wagoner As Champion

Stilwell's District had 4 entries into the Class 4A Football State Tournament: Poteau, Hilldale, Broken Bow, and Ada. Of these 4, the Poteau Pirates went the farthest, having reached the semi-final game during which the Wagoner Bulldogs hammered them 30-0. This sent Wagoner into the finals and sent Poteau back home with a very successful 11-2 season. Wagoner's opponent in the finals was a season long football juggernaut, the Cushing Tigers. The Tigers had averaged an unheard of 61 points per game and had crushed Elk City 56-14 in their semi-final game. Not

I looked back at the notes I had on my great-grandparents, Polly Maloy and William (Bill) M. Renfro. They lived in Chester, Arkansas a steep ride up from Elkins, Arkansas where the Maloy family lived in the 1880s. Other kin - Wright, Maloy, and Peters - had come west from Maloy, Alabama with the early Cherokees. They had worked their way west as opportunities opened-up. Next, they grew cotton and alfalfa

on Arkansas River land, and in the 1920s traveled west to Adair County in Oklahoma when typhoid affected the family. Once settled in Zion Community, MY grandparents rarely traveled farther than five miles from the farm; they would rear nine children. IF THEY HAD TRAVELED, I would have met my great grandfather Renfro who had remarried and was STILL ALIVE in Van Buren, and my second cousins in "Maloy Hol-

low" near Cave Springs. "IF ONLY" is a sad commentary. Visiting a Bunch cemetery and reading The History of Adair County, I found more names of kin who had lived in "Maloy Hollow" near Cave Springs. In 1923, I look forward to picking up the phone and inviting them to set awhile on the front porch. In this time of texting, "setting on the porch" time is invaluable.
