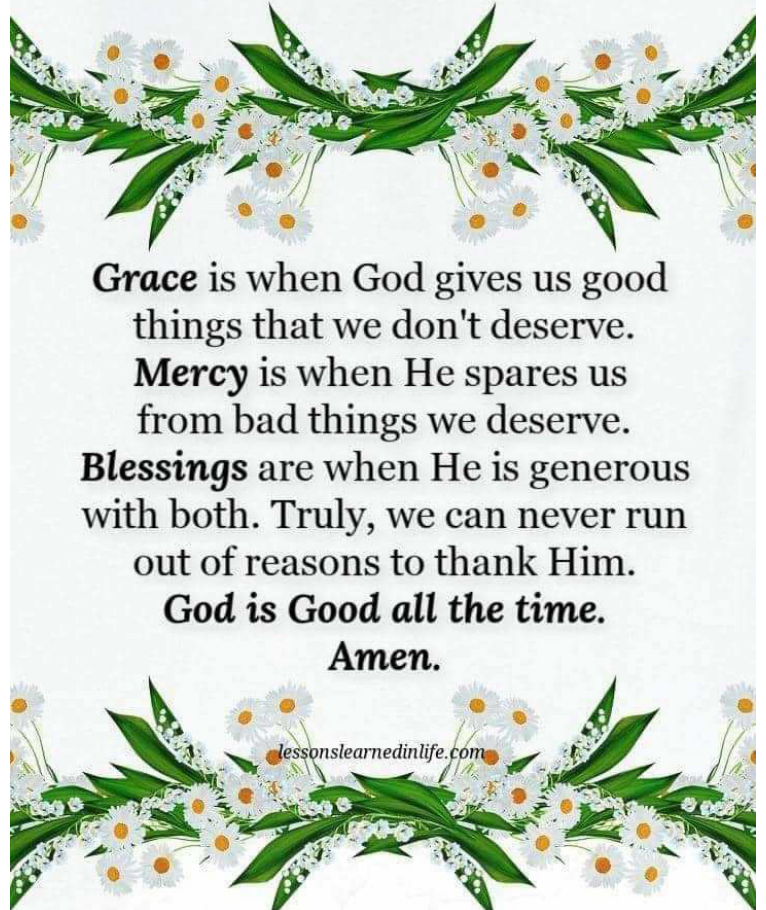

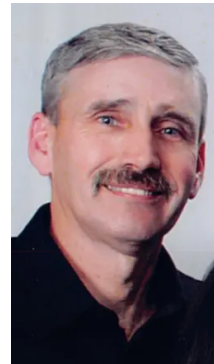
Bobby is reunited in eternal peace with his beloved wife Norma. He is also preceded in death by his parents William and Goldie Willis.

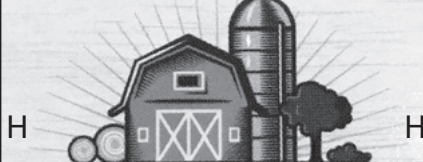
