ADAIR COUNTY REPUBLICAN PARTY MEETS AT DEPOT

On Monday, July 24, at the Stilwell Kansas City Southern train depot, a robust crowd of Adair County Republicans gathered to hear several speakers among whom was Wayne Hill, the vice-chairman of the Oklahoma Republican Party. Several local and state elected officials were present. Charles Boecher, District 1 Commissioner, Teresa Turner, Adair County Assessor, Jim Spray, Stilwell City Council, Mark Walters, ICTC Board Member, and Tom Woods, District 4 State Senator. The first speaker was Josh Hildabrand, Field Representative for District 2 Congressman Josh Brecheen. He gave a summary of the work that Josh Brecheen has been doing. One question that was asked pertained to impeachment proceedings against Joe Biden. He mentioned that there is some movement in that regard albeit the first target is to be Mayorkas, the so called "Border Czar." Then District 4 State Senator took the floor. Senator Woods had just returned from OKC, where the State Senate had convened in a special session to cast their vote to override Governor Stitt's veto of the Tribal Tobacco and Vehicle Compacts. Woods indicated that he had voted for the override, which passed by a margin of 34-7 with 7 Senators absent. The override extended the present Compact for a year. Woods believes that this is the right choice. It would give the parties additional time to hammer out an equitable solution. He stated that here is a significant amount of money at stake, in the neighborhood of \$50 million. In this writer's opinion, Senator Woods is doing his job well. Mark Walters spoke briefly and said: "I will work on bringing trade classes back to

the Inidan Capital Technology curriculum. As of now, there is only a cabinet making class." The next speaker to take the floor was Wayne Hill, who is serving as the vice-chairman of the Oklahoma Republican Party. (The chairman is Broken Arrow State Senator, Nathan Dahm.) The theme of his talk centered around the founding of our great Nation but before he got into it, he stated that the most important government entities are in our local government: school boards, the city council, and county offices. He said that electing right thinking conservatives to these will preserve the integrity upon which the founding fathers pledged "their lives and sacred honor." The first settlement was in 1607 when Jamestown was established for trading. The next settlement was in 1620 with the Pilgrim refugees landing at Plymouth Rock. He pointed out the similarity between the two groups in that they both declared that a new nation was to be established upon the principles of the Bible for the sake of spreading the gospel around the world. However, there also was a distinct difference. The Jamestown group held to slavery. The Pilgrims believed that slavery was immoral. Jamestown was in the south. Plymouth Rock in the North. Perhaps the tone had been set for the conflict that would take place some 250 years later? It was in 1611, when King James put his stamp on the King James Version (KJV) of an English translation of the Bible. The Pilgrims, who had been persecuted by King James and fled the country, eschewed the KJV in favor of the Geneva Bible, a work of John Knox, John Calvin and William Coverdale. Hill said that

the major point of difference in these two versions was in the theory of "Divine right of Kings." That "right" was abused by King James and later on by King George III, whose abuse precipitated the Revolutionary War. Hill went on to say that America has distanced itself from these founding principles and needs to return to them if there is to be any future for our Nation. One of the most egregious abuses of the current regime is the complete trampling of our Constitution. He gave an example of how almost all of Biden's executive orders are patently unconstitutional. As a matter of fact, the powers of the federal government are limited and are enumerated in Article I, Section 8. All other powers are reserved for the separate states. Yet, ultimately, the real power lies in the people of the Republic, a government "of the people, for the people and by the people" and their right to "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness." From today onward, let us continue our vigilance at the local level. It was David Pickle, Adair County Republican Party Chariman, who said that because of the work that has been done, Adair County now has 55% registered Republicans whereas it was not too long ago that the Deomcrats were in the majority. Our work is far from over until restoration is complete. On August 16, at 6:30 pm, District 2 Congressman Josh Brecheen will be at the Depot to update his work in Congress. Brecheen, a freshman Congressman, has already made significant inroads with membership in two vital committees: Budget and Border Security. Be sure to come by and enjoy refreshments and a refresher on Josh Brecheen's work.

FLOATERS AND BUOYS

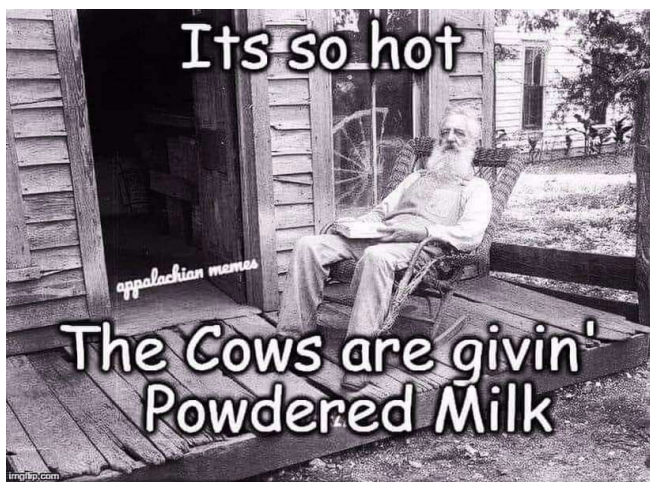

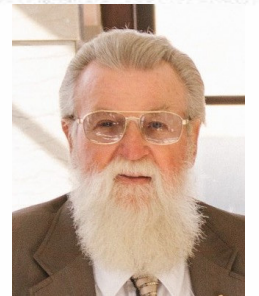

VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE APPROACHES

18, August 2023, is the last day to apply for voter registration in order to be eligible to vote in the September 12

Kansas Public School (SD I00321) Special Proposition Election, Adair County Election Board Secretary Jan Wilhite said today.

Wilhite said that persons who are United States Citizens, residents of Oklahoma, and at least 17 1/2 years old are eligible to apply for voter registration. However, you must be at least 18 years old to vote.

Applications must be received by the County Election Board or postmarked no later than midnight, August 18.

Applications postmarked after that time will be accepted, but will not be processed until after the September 12 Election. Applications may also be submitted to any motor vehicle agency that is also an official voter registration agency by the submission deadline.

Applicants will be notified in writing when their application has been processed. Approved voters will receive a Voter Identification Card in the mail. Some may receive a letter that explains the reason or reasons the application was not approved. Wilhite said those who do not receive a response within 30 days of submitting their application should contact the County Election Board office immediately.

The Adair County Election Board reminds voters that applications must be approved by the County Election Board Secretary in order to vote.

Registered voters who have moved to Adair County from a different county or state will need to complete a new Voter Registration Application in order to be eligible for elections in Adair County. If you have moved within the county and need to update your address, you may make changes online using the OK Voter Portal at oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp or complete a Voter Registration Application.

Voter Registration Applications can be downloaded from the State Election Board website at oklahoma.gov/elections. You may also complete a form at your County Election Board. Most post offices, tag agencies, and public libraries have applications available upon request.

The Adair County Election Board is located at 220 W. Division and is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. For questions, please contact the Election Board at 918-696-7221 or Adaircounty@elections.ok.gov.
