Brian Bingman drives home a point.. On Monday, November 28, at 6:30 pm in the Library Conference Room, a receptive audience gathered to hear Brian Bingman, who has announced his candidacy for Oklahoma Corporations Commissioner. District 86 State Representative David Hardin also addressed the crowd. Mr. Bingman, who was born and raised in Sapulpa, is no stranger to Oklahoma State politics. After earning his degree from the University of Oklahoma in the energy field, he launched a career with various size oil and gas companies. He got his feet wet in local politics when he won a race for the Sapulpa City Council. It was not long thereafter that he became Sapulpa's mayor, a post which he held for ten years, mostly by default since it was a non-partisan and non-paying job. In 2004, Bingman won a seat in the State House. He said that that year the House had its first GOP majority in 80 years. His political career continued when in 2006 he

won a Senate race; in 2008, the GOP gained the Senate majority. The GOP has held that majority ever since. In 2016, Mr. Bingman "termed out." Because of his excellent reputation, Governor Stitt appointed him as Secretary of State and Policy Advisor. Mr. Bingman was not yet through with elected office. It was when Corporate Commissioner Bob Anthony announced his retirement after 36 years in that office because he was finally "termed out," that Brian decided to go after this open seat. Mr. Bingman believes that not only his political career but also his long standing work in the energy sector of Oklahoma's economy will serve him well as the next Oklahoma Corporations Commissioner. He emphasized that all sources of energy production are welcome. In the question and answer segment following his presentation, one of the audience members asked him about nuclear? He said that nuclear, which at the moment does not exist in Oklahoma, could also be part of the mix. The primary for this office is scheduled for June 2024. It will be the only statewide office on the ballot. David Hardin took the floor next. He talked about his recent trip to the Southern Border, to Eagle Pass, Texas. He said that the cartels have taken control of the border. "Their

Commentary by John Bankel weaponry rivals that of the U.S. military," he said. He saw heavily armed 30 foot skiffs roaring their 1050 horsepower motors up and down the Rio Grande. The illegals are coming from all over the world where the Border Patrol stops them, documents them and releases them into the U.S. There are sections of the wall with gaping openings. Representative Hardin asked about that. He was told that the landowners did not want the wall because it would diminish their property value. All in all, the border crisis will not be abated anytime soon. In this writer's opinion, the only remedy, if there is a realistic one, will be a toppling of the current regime by voting it out in 2024.



Poteau rode a perfect 12-0 record into their battle with the Blanchard High School Lions, who came into the game with an 11-1 record. #### Today's Trail Treks To..... The Electric Vehicle (EV) Dilemma...

It was recently that the Ford Motor Company announced its plans to cut back on its investment in a new EV battery plant, from the original 3.5 billion to 2 billion. The cutback means 800 fewer jobs. The reasons that Ford gave were a declining consumer interest in EVs and much higher manufacturing costs than originally anticipated. The battery, which adds more than a 1000 pounds to the vehicle, is the heart of an EV. It looks like the EV business has come down with heart disease. The batteries needed to operate every EV have some serious drawbacks and appears to be the albatross around the neck of the EVs future. Among the problems the battery presents are: short shelf life, high replacement cost, intensive use of nonrenewable components, environmental mining damage, exploitation of child labor (mostly in China), inordinate dependence on our main adversary, China, for raw materials and huge

consumption of fossil fuels in the manufacturing process. Yet, these are not the only drawbacks. Here are 7 Reasons why Electric Vehicles do not make sense:

Reason #1: Range anxiety is the top reason why drivers refuse to go electric. One can't go very far on a full charge. Reason #2: Charging takes a half-hour or more, assuming one can find a charger.

Reason #3: Electricity needed for charging is most likely generated by the use of fossil fuels, anathema to "climate changers."

Reason #4: Power grid collapse, if all vehicles would be electric.

Reason #5: Lack of crucial materials for the long haul to build batteries, among which are Lithium, Cobalt, etc.

Reason #6: The manufacturing process is an environmental nightmare. Lithium production alone is so toxic that even the most ardent EV enthusiast does not want it anywhere near them. That is why virtually all of it is done in China, making us dependent on our arch adversary. Reason #7: EV battery performance drops significantly in cold weather and in hot weather.

Taking all of the foregoing into consideration, the EV future looks shortlived and will Eventually Vanish (EV) into a distant memory of mankind's folly. The world economy runs on oil!






