


Lana Gass: Champion



"Champions are made, not born" so goes the old saying. Lana Gass is proof. From the age of 5, Lana began playing softball, basketball and practiced dance. She soon found that softball was where she wanted to put in the time and effort to fulfill her dream of someday playing for the Oklahoma Sooners women's fastpitch team and winning a national championship. She was shooting for the top of the heap. Over the course of her time at Stilwell Zion elementary and middle school. Lana pursued her dream with relentless determination. For high school, she chose Tahlequah Sequoyah where she played both basketball and fastpitch softball. She tells about how, in her first 3 years, the softball team made it to the Oklahoma 3-A State semi-finals each year only to get bumped out of the competition. The team started calling it the "semi-final curse." Still, the hallmark of true champions is not in winning but in getting back up with renewed determination to win. In Lana's senior year, the team once again found themselves in the semi-finals only this time they were not to be denied. For the first time in the school's history, the State Championship Trophy was brought home to adorn the trophy case at Sequoyah High

School. More success was about to visit Lana Gass. Although OU did not come knocking on her door, Rogers State University did and offered her a maximum scholarship. She was recruited as a catcher, despite the fact that she had only limited playing time at that position. Lana considers herself a "utility" player in the infield. At Rogers State, which has been coached by Andrea Vaughan for the past 28 years, she was asked to try a totally unfamiliar position: right field. Being the champion that she is, she put in the work needed to learn the position. In her second year, the 2022 season, the team caught fire finishing a national championship season with a superb 53-10 record. A book could be written about what it took to get there. While there is not room enough in this article to go into all the details, the team found itself in a "do or die" predicament in the Super Regional, down 1-0 against perennial power, the University of Central Oklahoma. Rogers had to win the next 2 games to advance to the National Tournament in Denver. Game 2 turned out to be a 16 inning marathon win for Rogers; the teams now stood even. After a short rest, they went at it again. Lana and her team prevailed and punched their ticket to Denver.

When asked what the highlight of the 2021 season was, Coach Collins did not hesitate and said, "Beating Salisaw!" that old arch rival. 

Mullin It Over: Preserving our Freedom

The loss of America's energy independence has unsurprisingly come with consequences. The most obvious to consumers is the increased pain at the pump. However, there is one consequence that is less apparent but is no less important. Biden's disastrous energy policies are not just weakening America, they are directly emboldening one of our nation's greatest adversaries: China.


One of the key components of Joe Biden's Green New Deal agenda is the push for electric vehicle (EV) production. Aside from the steep price that prohibits many Americans from the luxury of purchasing an EV, Biden's rush to green overlooked what was needed of the U.S. supply chain to successfully implement his proposal. In turn, the United States is forced to rely on China to meet the president's climate goals.

Electric vehicles need batteries and batteries require critical minerals. While we may know what minerals to look for and often where to look, it takes ten years to permit a mine in the U.S. with Biden's current approval process. For this reason, the U.S. remains 100 percent dependent on imports for 17 key mineral resources and 50 percent dependent on imports for another 29 mineral commodities from China, though most are available right here at home.

Instead of implementing policy to strengthen the U.S. supply

chain and support our domestic producers, the Biden Administration further weakened our country's ability to utilize our own critical mineral supply. The administration canceled two federal leases to mine in Minnesota, which could have provided enough nickel to manufacture over 200 million electric vehicles and enough cobalt to manufacture 42 million. They also reimplemented heavy regulations on our producers under the National Environmental Policy Act of which even environmental groups have found issue.

It doesn't stop there. Biden's subsequent solar panel push has backed our country into the same corner. Eighty percent of solar panels are made in China, whose Xinjiang region's solar energy technology sector has been linked to forced labor. Despite this fact, Biden recently announced the move to waive tariffs on their solar panel imports in the name of clean energy supply. These tariffs were previously established by President Trump in response to their abhorrent labor practices and lack of environmental standards. This decision emboldens China's human rights abuses but also allows for China to dominate the American industry due to their access to critical minerals and our country's increased need for this resource.


