“Buy fresh, buy local” has become more and more popular each year since that slogan was first coined. Indeed, there is nothing better than fresh picked, “home grown” produce, jellies, jams, bread, along with local honey fresh from the hive that can’t be beat. Besides all that special goodness is the knowledge that your purchases support your community enterprisers. A win-win for sure. Last Saturday, my collaborator, Stephanie, and I stopped by the Westville Farmers Market, located at the Mid-County Community Center, just north of Barren Fork Creek. There were several vendors there with offerings ranging from potted flowers and succulents, fresh produce, fresh baked bread, homemade jellies, jams, apple and pear butter, local honey, (Is your mouth watering yet?), and one vendor who had an assortment of pens, key chains and sundry phone gadgets. We bought from each vendor. And then, on to the quest for strawberries. We had heard that Jeff Collyge had berries galore at his farm in Westville, located a mile west on 62 and then north on 4370 Road. Jeff and his son, Dylan, have been growing berries over the last 8 years. This year their harvest brought in an admirable 4th place Festival auction finish. Even better, was their flat garnered the highest price of over \$3000. Jeff and

Dylan are understandably proud of that distinction. While we were there, a handful of field hands were picking fresh batches of berries. A stack of picked flats sat under the tent. With an attractive price of \$30/flat and \$5/QT, these beautiful berries beckoned to be bought. Jeff told us that his field is state-of-the-art. He is positioned to produce prize winning berries for years to come. Collyge Farms also grows watermelon and cantaloupe. Of course, the proof is in the pudding. My first bite of a Collyge berry told me all I needed to know: sweet, juicy and delicious. It be would hard to find a better strawberry this side of heaven. Finally, when I asked Jeff how much longer his berries will be available, he replied, “Until the end of June.” Come on down and get you some!

Thinking back over quotes from Mark Twain, I'm beginning to understand why he kept his autobiography unpublished until 100 years later. Truthful thoughts in a diary may cause anguish to a reader. There are always two sides to a situation. Taken out of context or without all the details, feelings can be hurt. At age 10, I would have spent two summers with my granny on the farm. I had probably finished 4th grade. My mother in later years, voiced Granny's pride in me when she said, "It' can do anything." Meaning of course that I enjoyed doing all the different chores on the farm – gathering eggs, hanging clothes to dry on

the outside metal lines, getting the mail from the roadside mailbox, drawing water from the well, watching Granny cook, learning to make yeast bread and corn bread, and helping to strain the cottage cheese. Why did Granny use "it?" She spoke that way because her mother had passed, and she was reared by a lovely woman who had little formal education. However, the lady had high standards of behavior. She taught Granny certain quips that I remember to this day. "Whistling girls and crowing hens all come to some bad end," and "Sunday angels and everyday devils." My grandmother would only have another year or

two of formal education after her mother's death; she took over the household until her father remarried years later. However, her education was sufficient to rear 9 children, one a grandchild, while doing farm chores which included gardening, canning, milking, and selling cream and eggs in town or to neighbors. Like the folktale that came out of the 1930's, she believed in "The Little Engine That Could." There wasn't anything she couldn't do. As Lily Tomlin playing 5 1/2-year-old "Edith Ann" on TV would have said, "AND THAT'S THE TRUTH."

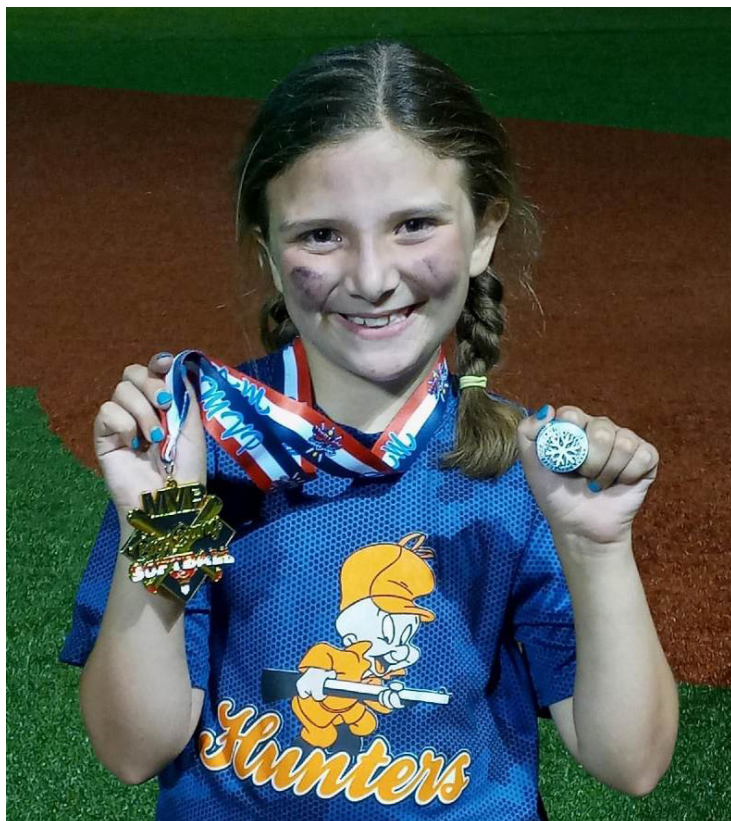

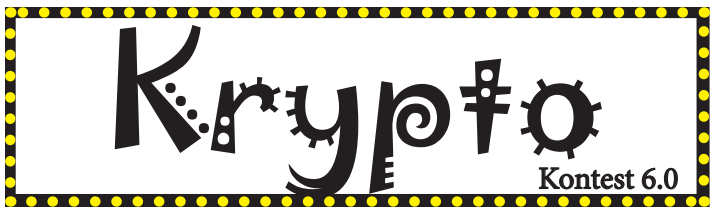


### THE KIPLING KORNER

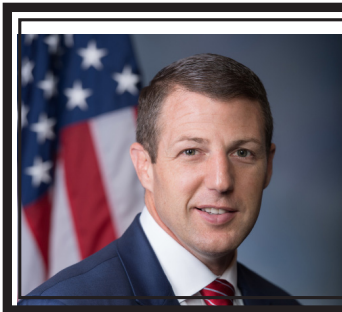

# Fighting for Oklahoma's Military Installations

May is Military Appreciation Month, and there is no better place to celebrate our nation's active-duty service members and veterans than right here in Oklahoma.

Home to five world-class military installations and over 300,000 of our nation's veterans, Oklahoma is instrumental in supporting the greatest military in the world. As the only member of our delegation on the Senate Armed Services Committee, it's my great responsibility to ensure Oklahoma's military installations have what they need to protect our service members and defend our nation.

Over the past few weeks, I've again visited Tinker Air Force Base (AFB), Vance AFB, Altus AFB, and Fort Sill to meet with military leaders and understand how I can best fight for them in Washington, D.C.

Our first stop was Tinker AFB where we met with Col. David Miller and received a brief on military construction and operations updates on the TACAMO/E-6B squadron, E-3, KC-135, and

KC-46 aircrafts. Tinker AFB is a vital resource for our pilots and Oklahoma's economy, employing over 26,000 military and civilian employees and generating over \$3.51 billion in annual statewide impact. In fact, Tinker is the largest single-site employer in Oklahoma.

Spending time on Base is essential to understand the unique needs of every installation. Under Commander Col. Jay Johnson, Vance AFB is transforming capable students into world-class pilots for front-line air mobility aircraft, bombers, and fighters. While visiting Vance, the premier venue for undergraduate pilot training, I toured the Air Traffic Control Tower, visited the 33rd Flying Training Squadron, and reviewed Advanced Air Mobility Simulators.

When touring Fort Sill, I had the honor of meeting with Base leadership to receive an operations overview of the Field Artillery School which trains 10,000 students each year. I spoke with Col. John Barefield and Col. Curtis King about fleet expansion,

modernization, and training Ukrainian forces in Oklahoma. The future of Fort Sill, from equipment to personnel, is heading in a positive direction.

We concluded our Base tour in Altus, where I met with Vice Commander Col. Patrick Brady-Lee of the 97th Air Mobility Wing for a briefing and tour of Altus AFB. I toured a KC-46 and learned firsthand how Altus AFB became the premier installation for producing the world's most inspired, proficient, and adaptive mobility warriors to deliver air power for America.

While each of our military installations, including the McAlester Army Ammunition Plant play different roles in faithfully supporting our Armed Forces, they all produce world-class service members and civilian personnel who are working every day to protect and defend our freedoms. I will never stop fighting for them in Washington. God bless our military this month and every month.




