She took her vim, vigor, vitality and vision, along with her business acumen and set the wheels of change in motion. In 2021, she was voted onto the City Council. She sold the voters on her vision for the town. In addition, through her well developed business network, she influenced other like-minded people to join her. One of the first projects, The Parks Master Plan, was the installation of a splash pad. The Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust (TSET) was instrumental in making this

happen with a \$700k Grant. Grant money was also supplied by the Oklahoma Department Of Transportation (ODOT) and Cherokee Nation. This was the first phase in the improvement project. Next, there is a \$1 Million Downtown Project, located where the old Nursing Home was, whose Phase I includes a Pavilion, Art Wall, walking paths from the Splash Pad, food truck spaces along with outdoor games. New lighting and sidewalks are also in the plans. Ms. Mitchell mentioned that, long term,

When I asked her about expanding business opportunities, she said that the current infrastructure needs to be improved before any large scale businesses can be attracted. 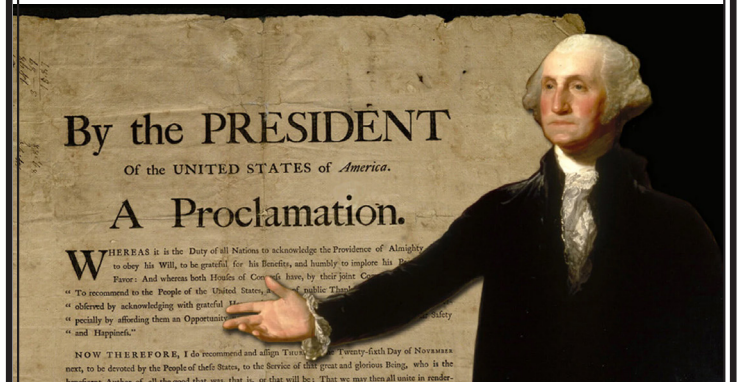

As soon as he grabbed the mike, he was off to the races sounding like the Ringmaster at a Ringling Brothers Circus with a booming voice and unbridled enthusiasm. He was funny, he was provocative and, from time to time, he put his opera trained voice to good use as he broke out in song while he paraded around the gym floor. His role for the evening was to introduce the Cheerleaders, the Wrestling team and the boys and girls Basketball teams. The Cheerleaders came first; the team topped it off with a classic choreographed cheer

routine, to enthusiastic applause. The Cheerleaders are coached by Erika Leach. The Freshman and Varsity girls basketball teams, coached by Terry Sweeney and Matt Lea, grabbed the spotlight next receiving hearty applause. Along with the introduction of the Boys Freshman and Varsity basketball squad, coached by Mike George and Nick Davis, the fans got a good look at the boys in action with two 10 minute scrimmage games. The final group to be introduced were the girls and boys Wrestling teams. Their new coach, Football Assistant Coach, Chris Henry, took to the mike and gave a brief rundown of the girls squad.
