MORE INSANITY

We Americans, at least those of us who were born here, are required to show a photo ID for countless things we do each day. If you want to purchase a firearm, fly on an airplane, or purchase some hay-fever medication that was once available on the local Wal-Mart shelf you must show a photo ID. I agree that some of the regulations are a little redundant, but there is one requirement on photo ID that I do agree with, it is the requirement when you go to your polling place to vote. A few days ago, the Biden administration's Attorney General made a statement that I totally disagree with.

Attorney General Merrick Garland, on March 3, declared that efforts by states to implement voter ID laws are "unnecessary" and "burdensome." According to Garland, the right to vote "is still under attack," though he provided little evidence in his speech for how requiring identification would be an assault on voting rights. AG Garland stated, "One thing that must not be open for debate is the right of all eligible citizens to vote and to have their vote counted." I just wonder how does anyone know if the potential voter is eligible or not unless they can prove it with an ID? When

Garland took office, he doubled the size of the voting section of the Civil Rights division; according to him he is challenging efforts by states and jurisdictions to implement discriminatory, burdensome, and unnecessary restrictions on access to the ballot, including those related to mail-in voting, the use of drop boxes, and voter ID requirements. While Garland opposes voter ID most Americans support requiring an ID to vote, a Gallup poll from late 2022 found that eight in 10 Americans support them. In a recent Heritage Foundation article, the majority of Democrat, black, Latino, and low-income voters also support such laws and proposals. Those that oppose voter ID measures do not object to the requirement that voters verify their identity when voting—which is already standard in every state—but rather the means used to verify them. They claim that a significant portion of U.S. voters do not have a photo ID such as a driver's license, state ID card, or passport.

It seems to me that there is some kind of insanity that has become contagious, and too many of our elected officials have become infected. If any of us average American citizens want to fly

on a commercial airplane, we must have a photo ID, but if you are an illegal alien, you do not have to provide any documentation if you want to hop on an airplane. I just wonder how many illegals will be showing up at our polling sites wanting to vote in our elections this year? By some estimates over 8 million illegals have flooded into our nation since resident Biden took office; I might note that the population of my state of Oklahoma is a little over 4 million. It does not take a rocket scientist to know what is on the liberals' minds. They are wanting to flood our country with huge numbers of illegals and eventually grant them some kind of citizenship so they can vote for the ones that are kissing their backsides and providing all kinds of taxpayer-funded perks.
