Work on the new Stilwell City Hall is nearing completion, awaiting a February 16 Grand Opening.....

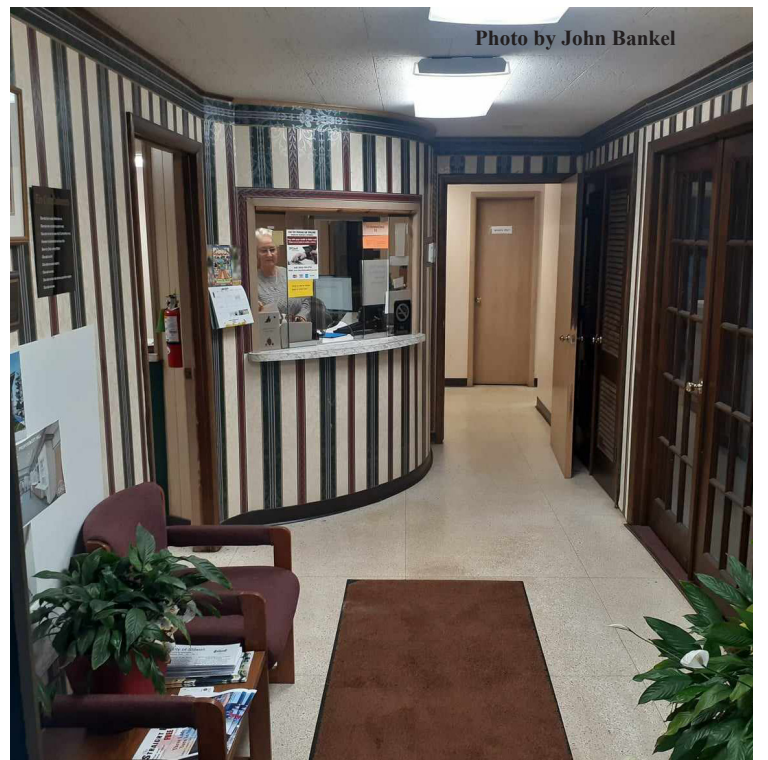
On my January 23 visit, one could feel a sense of anticipation and excitement within the walls of the Stilwell City Hall. City Hall is the hub of Stilwell's municipal government, a government which was formed by Charter in 1947. According to City Clerk Larry Nettles, who is serving his second term, the present facility became City Hall in 1992, having first served as a doctor's office. Denise Brown, who has worked as the receptionist for 7 years, told me that she used to visit that doctor while she was in high school. That Stilwell needs a new city hall goes without saying. Mayor Jean Ann Wright remarked that there are people that believe the

new building is way too big for a town the size of Stilwell. She said that that may be true today, yet it was built with the future in mind. That future officially begins with a Grand Opening on February 16 at 2 pm with a ribbon cutting. A number of dignitaries have been invited including Governor Kevin Stitt. On February 17, the public is invited to an Open House from 9 am til 1 pm. When I asked Amy Duncan, who has worked as an encumbrance clerk/purchasing officer for 8 years, her thoughts on the move, here is what she said, "I am very excited about moving to our new location. Will not miss the old city hall." Denise Brown told me, "I am

looking forward to a big bathroom. I will miss the closeness (proximity) of my colleagues." When I asked Mayor Wright her feelings, she said, "Excitement...a place to be proud of...we will be able to use the internet and the heater at the same time all in one building!...lol...plus plenty of work spaces." I told Larry Nettles, who has a rich sense of humor, with tongue in cheek, that there is a humor rumor going about that he lost a lot of weight so he could fit into the bathroom! While we both got a chuckle out of that one, it really underscores the acute need of a New City Hall; it will be the showcase of the future.

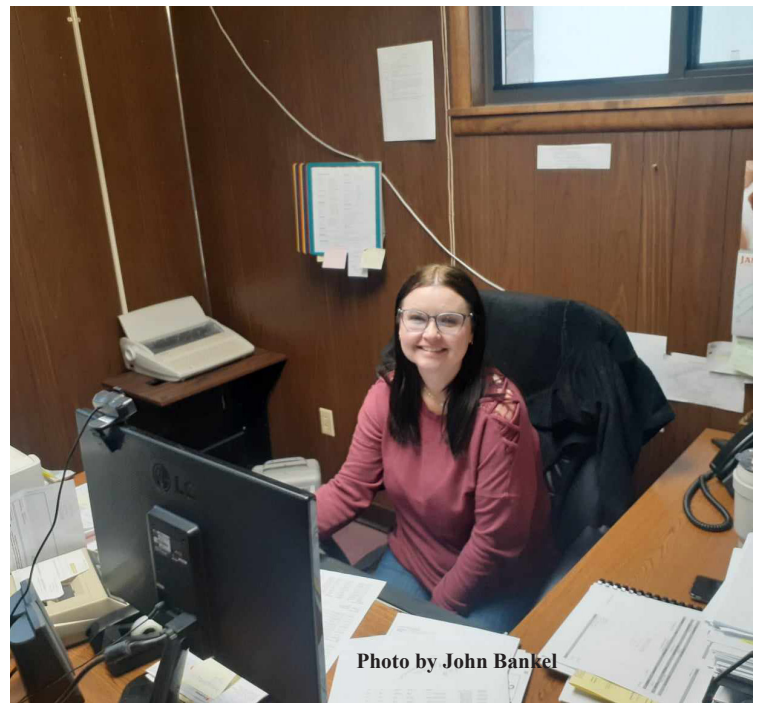

Indians Earn Gold; Lady Indians Bring Home Silver In Old Fort Classic Tournament

In the recent Old Fort Classic boys and girls basketball Tournament held at Fort Gibson High School, both the Indians and Lady Indians played into the finals. In the boys game, the Indians faced the Longhorns of Inola. As a state ranked team, the Longhorns posed a formidable threat to the Indians' championship aspirations. When the game was over, the Indians quelled Inola's own aspirations. There are no perfect basketball games, yet the Indians came close. After losing 2 of their starters, including eventual tournament MVP, Tyrus Teehe, early in the third quarter in a tight back and forth tussle, the Indians showed their bench strength, their poise and their basketball savvy by methodically executing their offense and defense. The result was an impressive 56-48 victory for the Old Fort Classic Tournament championship. In 3 tournaments so far this year, the Indians have come away with 2 championships and a 3rd place finish. In addition to this most impressive win, 3 Indians received All Tournament honors: Keller Hitcher, Braden George and Tyrus Teehee as Tournament MVP. After notching 3 wins in the tournament, the Indians will take an 11-4, 3-2 District, record to Checotah on Tuesday, January 23 in a District contest. There is every reason to believe that the Indians, who are polishing their game, will go deep into the State tournament. Tipoff at Checotah is 7:30 pm.

In the Girls championship game, Stilwell faced a familiar Fort Gibson squad. Stilwell had defeated the Lady Tigers in a previous encounter, 32-27. This time, in the rematch, the Lady Tigers got the best of the Lady Indians by a score of 52-46. Ft. Gibson established a 15 point 3d quarter lead, a lead which the Lady Indians were unable to overcome. Snowda Watie, Stilwell's stellar point guard, not only earned All Tournament honors, along with Prairie Holmes, but she also hit a career milestone of 1000 points-that is a heap of points folks!- and who knows what her final tally will be since there are still more games to go. In 3 Tournaments this season, the Lady Indians have finished 1st, 2nd and 3rd. Way to go Snowda; way to go Lady Indians!

Stilwell vs Checotah

On Tuesday, January 23, Stilwell traveled to take on the Checotah High School Wildcats. Both the boys and the girls tamed the Wildcats with one-sided scores: Indians 58 Checotah 35; Lady Indians 79 Checotah 27. On January 27, Stilwell is at Idabel. Tipoff 4:30 pm. The Lady Indians tipoff at 2:30 pm.

the red carpet for 5,000 illegals EVERY DAY, forever. State Income Tax Relief

Senator Micheal Bergstrom, R-Adair

Immediate Release: January 24, 2023

Bergstrom files special session bill to create a pathway to zero income tax
OKLAHOMA CITY- Sen. Micheal Bergstrom, R-Adair, has filed Senate Bill 1xxx for the upcoming special session. This legislation outlines a strategic pathway to gradually eliminate the Oklahoma state income tax while protecting state revenue. Gov. Kevin Stitt has called the state legislature into special session to cut taxes.

Bergstrom’s measure answers that call and offers a bold but reasonable pathway for easing the financial burden on hardworking Oklahomans while fostering a climate that promotes economic growth and job creation, particularly within the small business sector. The bill also sets up guidelines to protect state revenue and services.

“This bill is based on a careful review of Oklahoma’s economic history, including state government revenue and spending, over the last quarter century,” Bergstrom said. “SB1xxx is a comprehensive plan that paves the way for the gradual elimination of the state income tax, while also safeguarding the essential revenue required for public services.”

The initial tax cut will be a quarter percent, dropping the maximum rate to 4.5 percent.

“I was recently told by a gentleman that he has been trying to get his son to move to Oklahoma. He reminded his son that the cost of living was lower in our state, and the son agreed,” Bergstrom said. “But the son told his Dad that the state he lived in had no income tax and he just wasn’t going to move where the government takes almost five percent of what he earns.”

“I am committed to ensuring that the Oklahoma state income tax doesn’t hinder the hard work and innovation of individuals and businesses, and is not a reason for our children to move somewhere else,” Bergstrom said.

SB 1xxx can be considered when special session begins January 29, 2024.

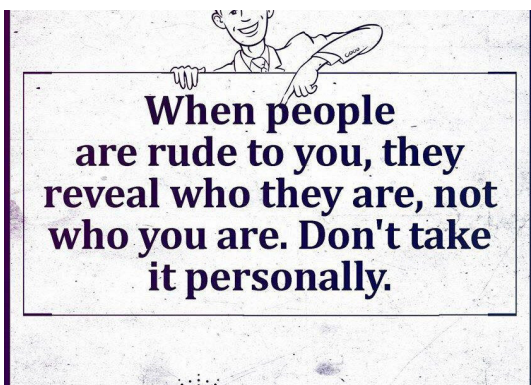

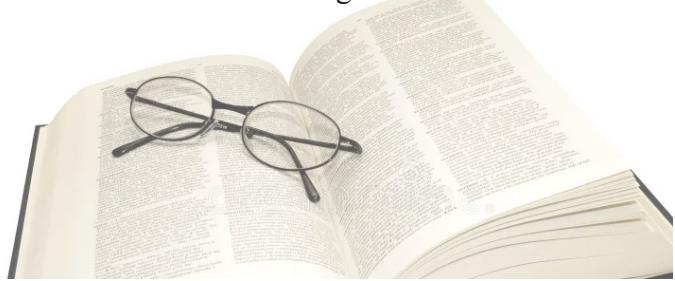


