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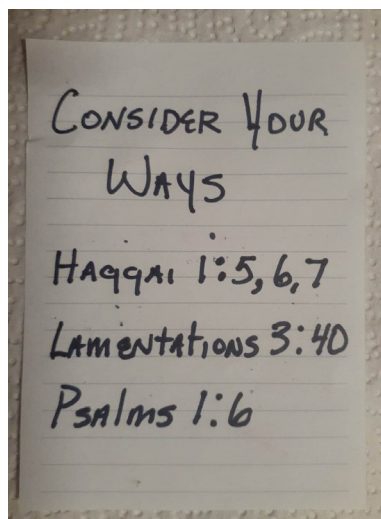

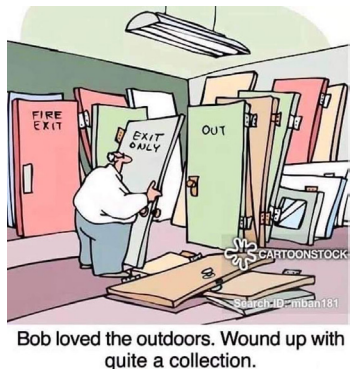

Today's Trail Treks To The Lowly Pencil

The other day, as I was walking past the planter in front of the Stilwell Library, I noticed a pencil lying on top of its dirt. It looked like a fairly new pencil. It had a point and an eraser that was a bit worn. I picked it up and got to thinking about "the Pencil"? It is quite a remarkable instrument. One of my recollections of pencils is about the ones that some of my grade school classmates loved to chew on. I never did. I did try it once or twice. They tasted awful and I really never got hungry enough to enjoy one. The eraser was another component that often got chewed. I did not chew erasers. I always thought the eraser was more valuable than the lead. The lead is what I used to make mistakes. The eraser was there to come to my rescue. I got to thinking about all the monumental writings that can be credited to the pencil. The old saying is: "The pen is mightier than the sword." In this saying "pen" is short for "pencil." Kingdoms have been set up and taken down by the written word, not to mention all of the draw-

ings that were done in pencil? Yet the pencil that we know today is a fairly recent invention. As a matter of fact, even though the pencil is often tossed aside with impunity, (like the one in the planter), yet it turns out that making a pencil is not a simple task. Start with the lead. The lead is graphite, although at one time actual lead was used. ("plumbum" is the Latin word for "lead"; hence the symbol Pb on the periodic table and from which the name "plumber" comes since the old time water and drain pipes were made from lead). Kids would put the tip in their mouths and their tongues would turn blue-green and get sick, sometimes to death. In those days, paint also had lead in it and many a child perished from eating this paint. Graphite is harmless. The wood is special also. The little metal ferrule, upon which the eraser sits, is special. And the rubber for the eraser comes from far off places like Sumatra or Borneo. And then all of those constituents have to end up in one place: the Pencil Factory, where God

only knows how many pencils are produced annually? Or imagine how many pencils have been produced since their inception and how many have been carelessly discarded without thought as to their real value. I am a retired Math teacher. I would insist my students use a pencil, preferably with a BIG eraser. I surely always needed one. Today the pencil is still very much around and surprisingly still costs very little. It could well be the best deal in town. Next time you pick up a pencil, treat it as a valuable friend. And try not to chew it!

Today's Trail has come to an end. Perhaps we shall meet again around the bend my friend. Meanwhile, may your Trail end up on the right side of the fence. Vaya Con Dios!
