## HOMECOMING KINGS: THE CROWNING MOMENT

It was a perfect night for football; it was a perfect night for Homecoming; it was a perfect night for what was about to transpire. On Thursday, October 12, the Cave Springs Hornets entertained the Gans Grizzlies to cap their Homecoming celebration. Gans came all the way from Logan County, about a 3 hour bus ride. Still, they came to play. This writer had never seen an 8 man football game. I picked a good one. It would turn out to be epic. Both teams played hard and fast and loose. All game long, there were thunderous hits that reverberated throughout the stadium; in the old days we would say, "the leather was popping." At the end of the half, the scoreboard read: Gans 8 Cave Springs 6. The thought occurred to me that this game would go down to the wire. The crowd roared when the Hornets took the lead in the 3d Quarter, 14-8. The Grizzlies came back to tie the game. And then scored again to take a 22-14 lead in the 4th Quarter. The Hornets responded with a touchdown and a crucial 2 point conversion to knot the score at 22-22. Then the game took the road to its epic conclusion. With a little over a minute left in regulation, the Hornets relinquished the ball to the Grizzlies. Gans took over on their own 30 yard line. With such little time remaining and a long way to go, it was clear that the quickest route to the end zone would be through the air. Three passes and 3 pass interference penalties on the Hornets, moved Gans deep into Hornet territory. The clock showed 15 seconds with the ball

at the Hornet 2 yard line. The Grizzlies were poised to put this game away. The crowning moment was about to happen. Gans called a running play. ## Reeling It In




