## Hoskin-Warner Campaign Event Special Report

The race for Cherokee Nation Principal Chief is heating up and rapidly coming to an end. On June 3, citizens registered to vote will cast their ballots not only for the office of Principal Chief, but also for Deputy Chief and several Council positions. There are 4 candidates seeking the Chief spot. Chuck Hoskin Jr. is the incumbent hoping to be able to serve for 4 more years. Those seeking to unseat him are Wes Nofire, who recently unsuccessfully ran for District 2 U.S. House Of Representative and has also served as a Cherokee Council member, David Cornsilk, a retired genealogist, and Cara Cow-

an Watts, who believes it is time to give the Nation's reins back to a woman. On May 16 at the Adair County Fair Grounds, Chuck Hoskin Jr. and his running mate, Deputy Chief Brian Warner, were well received by the robust and enthusiastic crowd. Both Hoskin and Warner touted their accomplishments, highlighting the construction of a much needed new hospital in Tahlequah and a new Wellness Center adjacent to the Wilma Mankiller Clinic. Hoskin also emphasized the continuation and expansion of the Cherokee Language preservation programs. Housing also remains a priority for

his administration. At the outset of Hoskin's speech he quipped that Hoskin-Warner rank third in the minds of the Cherokee people with first place going to a good hog fry, second place to Chicky's Chicken. The food for the event was provided by Chicky's. Hoskin-Warner may have remained in third place. Still, not to worry, neither the hog fry nor Chicky's is on the ballot. With 4 candidates vying for Chief, a run-off seems likely. Both Hoskin and Warner believe they have earned a second "turn at bat." We shall know after 7 pm June 3.

Memorial Day and decoration have passed by for another year and the graves look beautiful with all the colorful flowers. But in a couple of weeks, guess what? All of those high-dollar flowers that you lovingly placed on your friends and loved ones' graves will be tossed into the dumpster and sent to the landfill. My guess is that hundreds of thousands of dollars are spent each year on artificial flowers. While this is great for retailers, it's not so great for the environment. Fake flowers are made from plastic, synthetic mate-

rials, and harmful dyes obviously all bad for the ecosystem. Research shows that it can take up to 450 years for these flowers to decompose. While fake flowers are not recyclable, they are reusable. Even though, after exposure to the sun, some of the petals may have faded, others will still be in perfect condition. You can take a couple of bunches, separate them and make a perfectly good bunch that looks brand new. If reusing them is not your thing, then consider giving them away - donate them to a resale shop or non-profit

Organization that can fix them and resale them. You can find lots of ways- online or in books - to reuse fake flowers. So, when it's time for the grounds keeper to mow the cemetery, and the flowers must come up, please take the time to collect them. 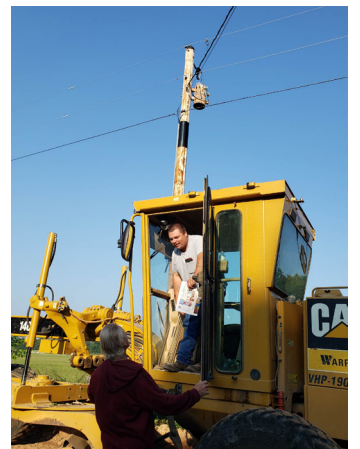
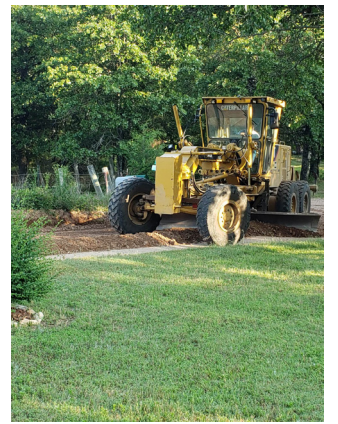

## THE CRUELEST TAX

When you look at all of the taxes we are forced to pay, it can be mind boggling. From income taxes to sales taxes and all in between it is no wonder people are having a hard time making ends meet.
