Stilwell Community Choir Spring Concert

On Tuesday, April 23, on the evening of a "Pink Full Moon,"* at the Stilwell First United Methodist Church, a revived Stilwell Community Choir performed its Spring Concert. It was the first Spring Concert in several years. The Choir got its start around 2006 when the late Damon Hall, a career Stilwell Middle School English teacher as well as a gifted piano player paired-up with long-time music teacher and well known vocalist, Mary Catherine Worsham to form the Stilwell Community Choir. The Choir received support from the City of Stilwell. In those days, the Choir met weekly and soon grew to over 30 voices. Their repertoire consisted of a broad spectrum of musical genres with a marked emphasis on Gospel holding 4 concerts per year. The Christmas and Strawberry Festival concerts became the highlights. The Christmas Concert played to packed houses at the

Stilwell Methodist Church until 2016. It was in that year that the Choir lost its much needed support. In 2018, Damon Hall passed away. The Choir appeared to be history. Yet not so fast. The interest among the members was still keen to re-boot the Choir. Then COVID hit. Another setback. Still Mary Catherine was undaunted. She forged ahead with practices at her home. Then, after COVID subsided, continued with practices at the Methodist Church. Instead of weekly sessions, the Choir met on the 4th Tuesday of each month. While not an ideal amount of practice, the Choir was revived. The turnout at the Spring Concert spoke volumes for a successful turnaround, with the auditorium filled almost to capacity. The enthusiasm of the audience was evident as they sang along to many familiar songs including the Armed Services theme songs, "God Bless America" which

was sung and signed by 4 members of the Youth Choir. After a medley of familiar American songs like "Oh Susanna" the last segment was filled with Gospel hymns like "Dig A Little Deeper," "Roll On Jordan," "I Surrender All" and "Total Praise" as the closing number. With the addition of the Youth Choir, consisting of Ben Brown, Lucas Brown, Natalie Brown, Mercy Bruner Zoey Corwin, Adaya Dieffenbach, Eden Dieffenbach, Lilly Newberry, Lucy Newberry and BrayLee Vann, this Concert was a special event indeed, a successful evening of LET THERE BE SONG. *Note: The "Pink Full Moon" was so named by some Native American tribes because the April full moon brought out pink flowers.






