## Stilwell City Election Coming On Tuesday, April 4

Eligible Stilwell voters will have the opportunity to go to the polls on Tuesday, April 4 to cast their votes for the following City offices:

- Mayor
- City Clerk/Treasurer
- Council Members for Ward 2,3 and 5

In addition, there will be a proposal for the voters' approval on the ballot. The proposal seeks to change the City Charter regarding the running of City elections. Instead of the City having that responsibility, it will be shifted to the County Election Board, who will then be in charge for all future City elections. Four things will remain the same:

- The Mayor and City Clerk/Treasurer will still take office on the first regular Council Meeting after the election
- The candidate that earns the most votes is the winner
- There are no runoffs
- Votes for Council members are cast only by the voters of their respective wards

Be sure to exercise your right to vote. It is your voice in the affairs of your government. See you at the polls.

### STILWELL ELECTION FILING DATES, TIMES, PLACE

Candidates for City offices may file at City Hall on:

- March 1 8am-5pm
- March 6 8am-5pm
- March 7 8am-5pm

# ELECTION DAY REMINDERS AND TIPS

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Tuesday, March 7, 2023, for the Special State-wide Election. Adair County Election Board Secretary, Jan Wilhite, offers these important tips to voters—especially those who will be casting a ballot for the first time.

## VOTING TIPS

Mark your ballot using the example posted at your polling place and inside your ballot booth. If you make a mistake, do not try to correct it. Instead, take your ballot to the precinct officials. They will destroy the ballot and issue a new one.

You do not need to make a selection for each issue on the ballot in order for your ballot to be counted. The voting device will cast votes only for those issues which you have marked.

Ballots can be read by the voting device regardless of how you insert the ballot into the system. If the system detects too many markings for a single office or question, an error code will appear. The voter can choose to submit the ballot as it is or request a new ballot.

If you need assistance or would like to use the audio-assisted ballot system, let a precinct official know. You do not have to show proof of a disability to use the audio-assisted ballot system.

Be sure to bring an approved form of identification. Federal and state issued photo IDs, passports, and tribal-issued, photo IDs are accepted. You may also use the voter identification card you were mailed when you registered.

If you forget your voter ID or your name is not found in the Precinct Registry, you may still cast a provisional ballot by signing an affidavit. A provisional ballot is sealed in a special envelope and counted after Election Day, once the voter's information has been verified by the County Election Board. Election results cannot be certified until all provisional ballots have been researched, verified, and counted.

Wilhite says election officials are there to assist voters and ensure all procedures are followed on Election Day. If you believe a law has been violated. Contact precinct or county election officials immediately. Do not wait until you leave the polling location.

Voting activity is generally slowest during the mid-morning and mid-afternoon, but the Election Board says lines and wait times can vary from precinct to precinct. All voters who want to cast a ballot should be in line no later than 7 p.m.

“Anyone who is in line by 7 p.m. on Tuesday and eligible to vote, will be allowed to vote,” Wilhite said.



## ADAIR COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL BASKETBALL ROUNDUP

## VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE APPROACHES

Friday, March 10, is the last day to apply for voter registration in order to be eligible to vote in the April 4 Board of Education Election, Adair County Election Board Secretary Jan Wilhite said today.

Wilhite said that persons who are United States Citizens, residents of Oklahoma, and at least 17 ½ years old are eligible to apply for voter registration. However, you must be at least 18 years old to vote.

Applications must be received by the County Election Board or postmarked no later than midnight, March 10. Applications postmarked after that time will be accepted, but will not be processed until after the April 4 Election. Applications may also be submitted to any motor vehicle agency that is also an official voter registration agency by the submission deadline.

Applicants will be notified in writing when their application has been processed. Approved voters will receive a Voter Identification Card in the mail. Some may receive a letter that explains the reason or reasons the application was not approved. Wilhite said those who do not receive a response within 30 days of submitting their application should contact the County Election Board office immediately. The Adair County Election Board reminds voters that applications must be approved by the County Election Board Secretary in order to vote.

Registered voters who have moved to Adair County from a different county or state will need to complete a new Voter Registration Application in order to be eligible for elections in Adair County. If you have moved within the county and need to update your address, you may make changes online using the OK Voter Portal at [oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp](http://oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp) or complete a Voter Registration Application. Voter Registration Applications can be downloaded from the State Election Board website at [oklahoma.gov/elections](http://oklahoma.gov/elections). You may also complete a form at your County Election Board. Most post offices, tag agencies, and public libraries have applications available upon request.
