Keaton Self: The Cherokee Artist As A Lad


Keaton Self is in the 7th grade at Maryetta School. He is beginning to distinguish himself in the art tradition of the Cherokee Style. Keaton tells of how he got interested in drawing after watching a YouTube video called "Art-4KidsHub" when he was a third grader. Today he is an award winning artist. While drawing is a pleasurable activity for Keaton, as a 13 year old he likes lots of other things. His favorite subject happens to be Math. Not surprisingly, he also likes to play video games. His favorite is playing "Fortnite" with his friends and cousins. I asked him if he likes sports? He said, "I

like to watch NFL football. My favorite NFL player is Aaron Rodgers." He added, "Too bad he got traded to the Oakland Raiders. Now I will have to get rid of all my Green Bay Packers stuff." Keaton is also an ardent OU Sooner fan. At Maryetta, he got involved in football as the team's student manager. Getting back to Keaton's art, the photo shows Keaton's award winning drawing which depicts traditional Cherokee creatures interestingly arranged to show "The Great Ballgame." Here is how Keaton describes his drawing: "The great ballgame is a popular game for the Cherokees...long time

ago they used to settle disputes with this game. It is still a popular game played among the Cherokees today." As a first place winner in The Florence Hart McInturff Memorial Award contest, Keaton not only received a Blue Ribbon but a monetary prize as well. This award is given to the student whose artwork the judges believe best portrays the history or the culture of the Five Civilized Tribes. By that standard, there is little doubt that the judges judged well. Perhaps Keaton Self will someday become a Cherokee Nation National Treasure. He appears to be on his way.



Today's Trail Treks To Stilwell High School Bond Issue

On April 4, voters in the Stilwell School District will decide on approving a property tax increase that would provide 1.75 million dollars to Stilwell High School. The purpose of these funds is to renovate the High School football field. The largest chunk of money will be used to install artificial turf, i.e., astro turf. One might ask, "Why do we need artificial turf? What is wrong with the grass that has been there since the beginning?" That is a fair question. To understand the answer, one must consider that the current grass field is full of potentially dangerous spots. One of the most treacherous areas is in the West end zone, where the field drastically drops off causing many a receiver looking for a pass to suddenly stumble and tumble into the fence. Great injury could be sustained. An-

other problem is with the layout of the field surface. It is designed for drainage so the surface slopes down to the sidelines. The design is called "turtleback" and is definitely "old school." With an artificial surface, the field can lie in a plane and provide a consistent surface for greater safety to the players and smoother operation for a more exciting and safer game. Also, the drainage and watering problem is eliminated. In addition to the playing field upgrade, there is also need for remodeling the press boxes and the ticket booth. Stilwell city is clearly on the move to bigger and better things. The High School plays an important part in shaping the future of Stilwell. In the past few years, the students and faculty of the High School have worked hard and have achieved many an award both academically and

in the sports arena. This upgrade will enhance the image that Stilwell High School is on its way to the top! The cost to the taxpayer is fairly benign. On a house valued at \$100k, the cost is approximately \$7.00/month or less than 25 cents/day. The children are the future of our town. They deserve our support. So show that you are on the Indians' team by voting "Yes" on April 4.

The proposed Charter Change on the Ballot will allow the Adair County Election Board to handle all the Stilwell City Elections.

Why is this good for Stilwell?

- * It will be a cost savings for the city,
- * It will allow city voting to be in the same location as other elections on the same day like School Board and ITCT elections,
- * All of the requirements for candidates and voters will be those established by State Law,
- * City Council Members will continue to be elected only by those who live in their ward,
- * There will continue to be no run-off elections – highest vote count wins, and
- * All elections will continue to be non-partisan.

On the Ballot, the Charter Change Proposition will be described as: "A proposal to amend the charter of the City of Stilwell so that all city elections will be conducted by the Adair County Election Board according to State Law except for the following four items which will not change: 1) all City Officers will take office on the first Monday in May, 2) there will be no run-off elections – highest vote count wins, 3) Council members are voted on only by the electors of their Ward, and 4) all elections are non-partisan."

Indians Fall In First Round Of The State Tournament

The Stilwell Indians made it to the "Big House" in OKC, the site of the 2023 Class 4A Oklahoma Boys Basketball State Tournament. Only 8 teams get to this point. In this year's tournament edition a rarity occurred: the 8 teams that made it, finished the regular season ranked 1-8, with Stilwell coming in at #7, with a 23-3 record. The 3 losses the Indians had suffered came at the hands of Edison Memorial Prep, a 5A school, Roland, a 3A school, and 4A Crossings Christian in the Area competition. The loss to Crossings put Stilwell in the Consolation Bracket, in which the Indians would be eliminated with their next loss. In the first round, Stilwell Faced the Kingfisher Yellowjackets. Kingfisher had taken home the Gold Ball the past 3 years. This game would prove to be "a tough row to hoe" as

Kingfisher dominated the Indians throughout the game. With a very deliberate disciplined approach and some unexpected cold shooting spells for the Indians, Kingfisher emerged the winner with a lop-sided 53-28 score. Stilwell can be proud of an outstanding season that produced a final record of 23-4 and a Top 10 state ranking. As the tournament progressed, Kingfisher ended up in the final game against another perennial Class 4A power, Douglass of OKC. As of this writing it has been reported that Douglass prevailed to capture an Oklahoma High School Class boys basketball record 18th State Championship. Don't worry. Stilwell will get 'em next year! On to the 2023-24 Season.

The Lady Indians played some outstanding defensive basketball to earn District and Regional Championships. In the Area skirmishes, the Lady Indians could not get past a determined Verdigris squad, coming out on the short end of the stick in their first game and then meeting Verdigris one more time in the Consolation Finals, the winner of which would proceed to the State Tournament. It was Vedigris that moved on by beating the Lady Indians the second time. Verdigris became Stilwell's nemesis. The Lady Indians finished the season with an admirable 17-9 record and should be poised to improve on that in the 2024 season. They came so close to going to "The Big House." Will 2023-24 be their year? We shall see.

REQUEST AN EMERGENCY BALLOT FOR THE APRIL 4 BOE ELECTION

Registered voters who become physically incapacitated after 5:00 p.m. Monday, March 20 and cannot make it to the polls, still have an opportunity to cast their ballot.

Adair County Election Board Secretary, Wilhite, said that state law permits voters who become emergency incapacitated after 5:00 p.m. Monday, March 20 to vote under special provisions. Wilhite said emergency incapacitation is something most voters don't think about.

"Voting is our constitutional right, but life happens. Injury, illness, or even childbirth can prevent a voter from being able to go to the polls. That's why it's important to make sure voters know their rights in the event of an emergency."

If you or someone you know becomes physically incapacitated after 5:00 p.m. Monday, March 20 contact your County Election Board as soon as possible. Wilhite says Election Board officials will work with you to make sure you have all of the necessary information to cast your ballot. Forms and information can also be found on the Oklahoma State Election Board website at oklahoma.gov/elections.

The Adair County Election Board is located at 220 W. Division, Stilwell, Ok and is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Election Board officials can be reached at 918-696-7221 or by email at adaircounty@elections.ok.gov.
