In the old days, before large corporations existed, it was the butcher, the baker and the candlestick maker that filled the needs of a town. In today's Business Buzz, we feature a mother and her two daughters at the Maranatha Thrift Store and their story of filling a need.

Kathy Dimko and her 2 daughters, Tricia Nikolas and Sarah Howard, opened the doors of The Maranatha ("Maranatha" is the Hebrew word for "Jesus come") Thrift Store, located at 1020 S Second St., Stilwell, in July of 2022. Getting to that point was anything but easy. Tricia exclaimed at the outset of our interview, "Never been a dull moment, but God is faithful." Their journey is a remarkable one. It is a story of tragedy and testing and triumph. After spending 30 years in Florida, the family made a move to Tennessee to a farm just

outside of Nashville. One day, Kathy's husband, Michael, told her that he had a vision to move to another place. After spending some time looking, they found a farm for sale in the Rocky Mountain area of Adair County. In 2014, they moved to that place on faith, without having sold their Tennessee property. Within a year of their arrival, Michael passed away. Kathy wanted to go back to Tennessee. She stayed. More tragedy was yet to come. Within a short period of time, Kathy's mother passed; and then Kathy's mother-in-law passed and when Tricia's husband, also named Michael, a man of 42, suddenly died, the grief stricken mother and her two daughters not only relied on each other but drew closer to their Lord and Savior. Kathy began a "grief share" group and began writing a column in the Democrat Journal. Then the ladies took up a call to manage the ORCO thrift store, at which they worked for 3 years until it closed its doors. It was then that the idea of open-

ing up their own thrift store began to take shape. With faith the "size of a mustard seed" they began their search for a place. God was faithful when they heard that the old Crozier facility on south Second street was available. They found favor in the sight of God and man and made a deal. The store has a touch of class that most other thrift stores lack. Besides a full assortment of gently used clothing, there are other items that people on tight budgets will find useful. There is even a small section of furniture. With the help of generous donations, Maranatha Thrift Store will always be able to fill someone's bill. You will find Kathy, Tricia and Sarah to be gracious helpers in finding what you are looking for. They even sell farm fresh eggs! They Risked It All/It's the Truth MEMORIES OF FARM AND FAMILY

My farm days didn't begin until I brought mother (Maxine) home to Stilwell in the fall of 2005 at age 93. Hurricane Katrina had wreaked havoc all along the Gulf of Mexico shoreline; we determined New Orleans wasn't a good home for seniors! I no longer wanted to run from storms or hide in the attic. NO INFRASTRUCTURE for a month, we lived in Texas and Colorado with friends for the "lost month" of August; our belongings remained behind at the treachery of thieves who often snuck past law enforcement blockades into the city. We bought "thrif

store" clothes upon arriving in Texas because we'd left quickly after putting plywood on the windows - the giant storm was coming. Traffic was bumper-to-bumper - all lanes traveling west; it took 4 hours to go 90 miles on Interstate 10. Eighteen years later, the ancestral Zion Oaks in Zion Community is our high and dry home! Many of you will remember those days; I met several people in Stilwell who had worked in New Orleans - restoring the communities in Louisiana that had been affected by the storm. Miracle-working roofers directly from Mexico had re-roofed

our home in 3 hours to preserve it so we could sell. We boxed and shipped "our lives" north to a Blackjack Street storage unit and later to our barn. Time was a blur. Except for essentials, much would remain boxed for years because the ANCESTRAL farmhouse was already filled with the necessities from two previous generations. I miss my friends in N.O., but NOT THE HURRICANES. Although my maternal grandfather hated storms and put his 8 children in the storm cellar when the sky turned green, there was never a tornado. God blessed them.

Adair County Republicans Opposing State Question 820

820 does not clarify whether private landowners and businesses would be allowed to prohibit or regulate the use of marijuana on their property or during the course of employment.





ELECTION DAY LAWS AND REMINDERS

Voters in Adair County are reminded to keep the integrity of the election system in mind, when going to the polls March 7. While ballot “selfies” or taking photographs of a marked ballot are legal, voters may not share or distribute the image through social media or by any other means while inside the election enclosure. Voters must wait until they leave their polling place before posting or sharing the picture with anyone. Improper use of the photo could result in a violation of the law. Voters may not use the image to coerce, influence, or intimidate another voter. Adair County Election Board Secretary, Jan Wilhite , says voters should be aware that violating the law has consequences. “While some offenses may seem minor, unlawful activity on Election Day constitutes a serious crime and could result in a misdemeanor or in some cases, a felony conviction. We want all voters to be aware of their actions and be respectful of the rights of others.” Wilhite said, it is illegal to disclose how you voted with anyone while inside the election enclosure. In addition, you may not remove a ballot from the polling place. Keep in mind that electioneering is prohibited within 300 feet of any ballot box while an election is in progress. This includes wearing or bringing visible campaign related paraphernalia into the election enclosure. Wilhite notes that no one except election officials and voters waiting to vote are allowed within 50 feet of any ballot box on Election Day. Certain exceptions are made for media and those assisting disabled voters. Voters are reminded that consuming alcohol of any kind or quantity within one-half mile of a polling place on Election Day is prohibited.

The polls will be open 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. March 7, 2023.

SAMPLE BALLOTS AVAILABLE FOR MARCH 7, 2023 ELECTION

Sample ballots are now available for the March 7, 2023 Election. Voters can download a sample ballot using the State Election Board’s OK Voter Portal at oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp or pick up a copy at the Adair County Election Board during normal business hours.

Adair County Election Board Secretary, Jan Wilhite , reminds voters that sample ballots are specific to each person. “If the OK Voter Portal indicates that you have no sample ballots available, it means you are not eligible to vote in an upcoming election. We recommend checking the OK Voter Portal to make sure you have an election before heading to the polls.” Wilhite said sample ballots will also be posted outside every precinct polling place on Election Day, so voters can review them before casting their votes.

The Adair County Election Board is located at 220 W. Division, Stilwell, Okla. and is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday . For questions, please contact the Election Board at 918-696-7221 or adaircounty@elections.ok.gov .

EARLY VOTING BEGINS THURSDAY

Early voting begins Thursday March 2 for voters in Adair County. Voters who will not be able to make it to the polls on Election Day, have the option of voting early at their County Election Board. Adair County Election Board Secretary, Jan Wilhite , said early voting is open to all voters. “You do not need to provide an excuse to vote early. Oklahoma allows early voting for all elections conducted through the State Election Board—from school board and municipal elections to state and federal elections. This is a great option for those who will be out of town on Election Day or who want to avoid long lines,” Wilhite said. Early voting is available Thursday, March 2 thru Friday, March 3 from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the County Election Board located at 220 W. Division, Stilwell . Wilhite reminds voters that early voting is not available at polling locations.


