Tom Woods Running for Oklahoma District 4 State Senate

Adair County Board of Commissioners Report

Larry Wood, District 3 and Chairman of the Board, called the February 14 meeting to order promptly at 8:30 am. After taking care of the preliminaries, i.e., Roll Call (Sam Chandler, Dist.2, Mike Winger, Dist.1, Larry Wood, Dist. 3 all present), Pledge, Prayer, Approval of Minutes and Old Business (of which there was none), the Commissioners dug right into the meat of the Agenda.

They quickly approved certification of 3 Fair Board Directors: Jim Dugger, Dist. 1, Jimmy Jones, Dist. 2, Wade Hampton, Dist. 3. Adair County EMS asked for moving forward on a contract with Westville, which got tentative approval pending the District Attorney's input. In addition, the Board moved to approve funds for EMS payroll using ARPA funds. Funds for supplies were given approval for \$150k for one month, ostensibly on a month-to-month basis.

And finally, as far as non-routine items are concerned, the Board approved a transfer within highway funds for Dist. 1. The

remaining items were routinely approved. There was no new business. Meeting was adjourned at 8:50.

BUILDING WHO BACK BETTER

Over the past year we have heard a never-ending mantra from resident Joe Biden and his lap dog press about his agenda to build back better. They are trying to con the American people into believing that all we have to do is keep writing hot checks, increasing the national debt, and everything will be fantastic. During the Trump presidency, tariffs were imposed upon Chinese solar cells in order to allow our American manufacturers to start up and compete with them. The result has been a rapid increase in sales by the American producers over the past three years, significant job creation, and a reduction in global greenhouse gas emissions since U.S. producers largely use natural gas-, wind-, and solar-generated electricity instead of powered by dirty coal plants in China. Now our all-knowing commander in chief has recently removed those tariffs. That action will be a fatal blow to the solar manufacturers here in our country. Instead of looking out for our own people, he is giving the Chinese Communist a huge wind-fall. Instead of striving to make our country self-sufficient, we will be relying upon a country that is openly hostile to the USA. We also need to remember who unleashed the global pandemic upon the world, whether it was intentional or accidental.

When you look at the actions of the Biden family it becomes evident to me that they are more concerned with increasing their bottom line instead of doing what is best for our country. Mullin It Over: Shall Not Be Infringed

In the wake of the tragic deaths of New York Police Department officers Wilbert Mora and Jason Rivera, President Biden traveled to New York City to deliver a speech on gun crime. Rather than using his time to honor the brave officers who lost their lives in the line of duty, the underlying message of his speech was clear: the Second Amendment is under attack.

When you look at President Biden's anti-gun argument, he's taking neither this amendment nor accurate facts regarding the weapons themselves into consideration. Frankly, he is ignorant when it comes to firearms.


