

Today's Trail Treks to Washita County, Oklahoma to visit the ghost town of Chief Cloud in the Final part of the series...

Ghost Towns of Oklahoma

It was in the 1890's when Indian Territory opened up for non-Indian settlers. The opening had been set for a specific day and when the bell sounded the land rush was on! There were those who jumped the gun and got there sooner than all the others; they became known as "the Sooners." When Indian Territory became the State of Oklahoma in 1907, the State became saddled with the moniker "The Sooner State" and Oklahoma has been riding high ever since! The Cheyenne-Arapaho reservation was no exception to the land rush as settlers flooded in and laid their claims for land. One such claim comprised 300 acres in what is today Washita County. There a town sprang up. They named it Chief Cloud after one of the Cheyenne chiefs. The town flourished for a while and at one point had 700 denizens. A school was built and businesses sprang up. The nearby town of Cordell became a rival of Chief Cloud. A tussle for the County Seat emerged, somewhat reminiscent of the battle for the Adair County seat between Stilwell and Westville at the turn of the 20th century, where Stilwell emerged as the winner. Chief Cloud lost the fight and thereafter started dwindling in population and prestige and, eventually, became a "ghost town." Today all that remains of Chief Cloud is the abandoned schoolhouse, which closed its doors in 1960. There are many more of such stories about Oklahoma towns that ended up with a similar fate. This series only touched upon a couple of examples. Perhaps, in the future, the Campaign Trail will once again embark on another Trek to Ghost Towns Of Oklahoma? May the town you dwell in flourish and avoid becoming a ghost of its former self. Today's Trail has come to an end. Perhaps we shall meet again around the bend. May your Trail end up on the right side of the fence and may the song you sing be, "Happy trails to you, until we meet again."


Dear John,



It was the first time he'd been able to see them since rushing them to the hospital.






