## **TERRY KIMBLE: 30 YEARS AT ASSESSORS OFFICE**

Terry Kimble celebrated 30 years at the Adair County Courthouse on March 10 with a fitting fete. He has served at the Courthouse longer than anyone else there. In 1993, Terry took on the job of Appraiser for the County Assessor. He recalls the "old days" when the Assessor's Office was stuck in the basement of the old courthouse. It was the "unpleasant" surroundings of the old courthouse basement that was largely responsible for getting a new courthouse. Terry tells of his beginnings as the Appraiser. "In those days, we did everything by hand. Records were kept on individual cards that were filled out by hand after measuring out a property, also by hand, and then filed into a myriad of file boxes. It was painstaking and time consuming work." He earned a degree in engineering and design form Northeastern State University. He fondly recalls driving to school with his mother, who was working on a degree in Elementary Education at the same time, eventually becoming a teacher. Although he did not immediately go to work at the Courthouse, he did work in surveying which would eventually serve him well. After starting his Appraiser job, he

found that being friendly was one of the biggest challenges he faced, since the Appraiser was, in most peoples' minds, considered to be the "tax man" and some of the receptions he got were unfriendly. After all, his evaluations often did result in an increase in property tax. Yet, despite all of that, Terry tells about how his job did become "easier" with the advent of database management via the computer. Today, instead of a bunch of handwritten cards to fumble with, Terry has an array of 3 computers that keep track of everything . Another major change that has happened in the recent past is the incursion of marijuana growers. of which, according to Terry, there are 120 grow operations in Adair County. Their presence, albeit legal, has pushed property prices through the roof. Today, Kimble's office now sits on the top floor of the new courthouse addition. A move "to the top" is a fitting top off for a long and successful career. When I asked Terry if he had any plans for retirement? Here is what he said, "I would like to work as long as possible since I really enjoy what I am doing." Adair County benefits from Terry Kimble's expertise. Congratulations are in order!

# **HOSKIN-WARNER** WIN BY LANDSLIDE

On June 3, Cherokee Nation voters went to the polls to vote for Principal Chief, Deputy Principal Chief and several Tribal Council seats. The race for Chief, which had a fairly crowded field of 4 candidates, was not close. The incumbent, Chuck Hoskin Jr, in a landslide victory, received better than 60% of the vote. In the Deputy Principal Chief's

race, the incumbent, Brian Warner, similarly won in a landslide, again with better than 60% of the vote. Some folks had conjectured that both races could have ended up in a runoff, but clearly that did not happen. The Hoskin-Warner result should be considered a mandate for 4 more years. However, two of the

as runoffs: District 3, which will see a runoff between Sara Drywater Barnett and Lisa Robison Hall, who received 28.83% and 43.33% of the vote respectively; in District 8, the runoff will be between Cody Poindexter and Jullian Decker, who received 39.30% and 20.53% of the vote respectively. The runoffs are Tribal Council races emerged scheduled for July 8. Wado!

When my grandparents moved from Coon Mountain to Zion, times were Life included: simpler. work, love, and obedience to God's laws. Their home was built simply, and its only book was the Bible. They welcomed nine children into this world; they lost one child to illness, yet they gained a grandchild to rear. Theirs' was a self-sufficiency almost lost today, except for "preppers" who learn skills for survival and stockpile food and other items in case of disaster. There

was no trash pickup in the early years, so they reused, rebuilt, repaired, or found other alternatives. There's a shelf in my house that has empty 1930's small glass containers that she piled in the far northwest corner of the treed area by the hog pasture fence, keeping it away from the animals. The treed area had shaded racks where new potatoes and onions matured and a concrete slaughter slab. In the house, Granny had shelves six feet long from floor to ceiling and three feet deep

supporting her preserved foods which would take her family from one growing season to another. She had the first wood stove pressure cooker in Adair County which can be seen in the museum. The canning process lasted throughout her lifetime and influenced her daughters. The impact was great enough that a few granddaughters still "put up" their own specialties.
