

The Church was decorated modestly yet displayed the feeling of Christmas with a resplendent tree, all in white lights, in the front. The Choir, standing behind the pulpit area, began

the service with "O, Come All Ye Faithful." The Pastor took his place at the pulpit and began with a prayer and then read from the Book Of Luke, Chapter 2, the account of the Lord's birth. I remember being thrilled by those words. I also remember how anxious I was to get back home, for it was on Christmas Eve that we opened presents. After singing several Christmas songs, we finished the service with Silent Night, first in English, then in German. At home, Mom and Dad made us stay out of the living room for what seemed like forever, as they prepared the

Christmas scene. Finally, the moment arrived to come in and see. The German tradition was for the children to sing "Ihr Kinderlein Kommet," (O Come Children, Come), "Tannenbaum, O Tannenbaum," (Christmas Tree, Oh Christams Tree). We ended with "Stille Nacht, Heilige Nacht." (Silent Night). I wish I had a recording of our singing, yet it still lingers in my mind. And then we opened presents, which by any measure, for a child, was the most exciting part! We were glad for the birth of the Christ child! Frohe Weihnachten!



OKLAHOMA CITY – Sen. Adam Pugh, R-Edmond, has filed legislation to attract military retirees from around the country to Oklahoma's classrooms. Senate Bill 1311 would create the Veterans Entering Teaching (VET) Act and pay for veterans' schooling to become educators if they agreed to teach in the state for three consecutive years.

"We've made tremendous strides in the last couple of years to get more teachers in our classrooms, but we still currently have more than 3,700 positions being filled by emergency certified teachers. We're grateful for these individuals stepping up and helping in our time of need but we're missing a major opportunity to utilize our highly trained and qualified military veterans as they look to begin their second career," Pugh said. "We need certified teachers, and this is an opportunity to let America's heroes utilize their vast expertise and experience to guide Oklahoma's future generations."

The VET Program would create a revolving fund to provide tuition and mandatory fee assistance for up to five years to students to earn a degree from an approved teacher preparation program at an institution of higher education within the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. To qualify, veterans must have been honorably discharged from the military within three years of enrollment. Students would be required to sign an agreement that they would earn a bachelor's degree from an approved teacher preparation program, meet teacher certification requirements, and agree to teach in a school district for three consecutive years. Those who failed to comply with the agreement would be required to repay their assistance or get a hardship waiver.

"We've been working hard to make Oklahoma the top state for veterans, and this is just another opportunity to help entice them to make our great state their home," Pugh said. "Not only would they be helping strengthen our education system by filling these teaching gaps and sharing their incredible skills, knowledge, and leadership with Oklahoma's students, they'd also be providing a much-needed economic boost for our local communities and state."

SB 1311 will be available for consideration when the Legislature convenes in February.

I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

Pledge of Allegiance Timeline

September 18, 1892: Francis Bellamy's pledge is published in "The Youth's Companion" magazine to celebrate the 400th anniversary of the discovery of America.

October 12, 1892: The pledge is first recited in American schools.

1923: The original wording "my Flag" is replaced by "the flag of the United States of America."

1942: The pledge is officially recognized by the U.S. government.

1943: The U.S. Supreme Court rules that requiring a person to say the pledge is a violation of the First and Fourteenth Amendments to the Constitution.

June 14, 1954: At the request of President Dwight D. Eisenhower, Congress adds "under God" to the pledge.

1998: Atheist Michael Newdow files suit against the school board of Broward County, Florida to get the phrase "under God" removed from the pledge. The suit is dismissed.

2000: Newdow files a lawsuit against Elk Grove Unified School District in California arguing that forcing students to listen to the words "under God" is a violation of the First Amendment. The case reaches the Supreme Court in 2004, where it is dismissed.

2005: Joined by parents in the Sacramento, California, area, Newdow files a new lawsuit seeking to have the phrase "under God" removed from the Pledge of Allegiance. In 2010, the 9th Circuit US Court of Appeals denies Newdow's appeal finding that the pledge does not represent a government endorsement of religion, as prohibited by the Constitution.

May 9, 2014: The Massachusetts Supreme Court rules that because reciting the Pledge of Allegiance is a patriotic, rather than a religious, exercise, saying the words "under God" does not discriminate against atheists.

Governor Stitt Celebrates Launch of Oklahoma Parental Choice Tax Credit

Thursday, December 07, 2023

Governor Kevin Stitt today celebrated the launch of the Oklahoma Parental Choice Tax Credit program and revealed the Oklahoma Tax Commission (OTC) received over 30,000 submissions within the first 90 minutes of launch. OTC, alongside its operational partner Merit, began accepting applications on Wednesday, December 6, 2023, at 2:00 p.m. CST. To date, approximately 140 accredited schools have been registered to participate.

"I'm elated that parents and students are taking advantage of the most transformative change to Oklahoma's education system in decades," said Governor Stitt. "School choice should be for everyone, not just the rich. What we've accomplished is a victory for students and a step towards true education freedom. It is amazing to see the demand for this program, and I hope the legislature will consider ways to allow more families to apply for this tax credit in the future. I applaud the team at the Oklahoma Tax Commission for a successful rollout, and I look forward to cheering on students as they enroll in a new era of educational excellence in our state."

Signed into law by Governor Stitt in May 2023, the Parental Choice Tax Credit program gives parents more control over how and where their children are educated. The program gives Oklahoma parents up to \$7,500 per tax year for private school expenses, tuition and fees, and parents who homeschool their child qualify for a \$1,000 tax credit.

Keisha Booth, an Oklahoma mom of four in Clinton, OK, praised the program: "As a single mother of four children, I can attest this program comes at a pivotal and crucial time for my family and our country. The oldest of my children is a senior in high school and the youngest will just be starting his education in August 2024. I am honored and grateful to have the opportunity to put our tax dollars to great use while securing a promising education for my children."


The Oklahoma Tax Commission will give priority consideration to applicants with a household income under \$150,000 Adjusted Gross Income and there are no fees to apply. To receive priority consideration, taxpayers must submit their applications on or before February 5, 2024.

Genifer Gifford, an Elk City, OK mother of five, is thrilled to have easy access to more education options: "I'm beyond grateful for the tax credit because it allows parents to choose schools that are a better fit for their child. I have some children in public schools, but this helps with having one child who has done much better in the private school setting. The process was self-explanatory and simple. I was able to complete the whole process in under 2 minutes."

Oklahoma taxpayers interested in the program can visit www.parentalchoice.ok.gov to explore participating schools and submit an application.



BOARD OF EDUCATION PRIMARY ELECTION ANNOUNCED

The Adair County Election Board has announced that a Primary Election will be held for Board of Education Office No. 1 in Dahlonegah School District, and Office No. 4 in Westville School District on Tuesday, February 13, 2024. State law mandates a primary election be held if more than two candidates file for the same school board office. The candidates are: Dahlonegah: Kenny Limore, Jr., Randy McCarter, and Michael Brown.

Westville: James Hinkel, Jeremiah Atha, and Charlotte Wood .

According to Adair County Election Board Secretary Jan Wilhite , if one candidate receives more than 50% of the votes, that candidate will be declared the elected official. If no one receives more than 50% of the votes, the top two candidates will vie for the office in the April 2, 2024 Board of Education General Election.

OPTIONAL TEXT: Candidates who filed for office but will appear on the General Election ballot ONLY are as follows: (LIST SCHOOL DISTRICT, OFFICE, CAN-DIDATE NAME)

OPTIONAL TEXT: Candidates who filed for office unopposed and will NOT AP-PEAR on the General Election ballot are as follows: (LIST SCHOOL DISTRICT, OFFICE, CANDIDATE NAME) Voters who are registered and reside at an address within the geographical boundaries of the Dahlonegah and Westville Public School District are eligible to vote in both the Board of Education Primary Election and General Election.
