Indian Capital offers opportunities to high school and adult students in Adair, Muskogee, Cherokee, Wagoner, Sequoyah, McIntosh and part of Okmulgee counties. Voting will take place at the normal precincts in these counties on April 2 nd.

David was an educator for 38 years, employed by ICTC for 25 years, in Stilwell for 17 years as Campus Director and 8 years in Muskogee as the **Business and Industry** Director. Under his leadership, ICTC became the third largest Tech Center in the state due to the increase of Industry training students attending classes. He was recognized with the Distinguished Service

Award in 2010 by Superintendent Tom Stiles.

David's platform is "Save the Trades." Many construction and industry trade programs have been closed over the past decade under the current board's leadership, and not always due to low enrollment. ICTC is currently serving only 18.6% of the junior and senior high school students from the 50 participating high schools. David would like to bring ICTC back to its original intent of training high school students with certifications that would empower them to make a good living. He also believes that the ICTC School Board should be transparent to their communities, and allow their input on what programs should be offered to best meet their needs.

David married his wife Kathy in 1977 and together they have four children, 14 grandchildren and one great-grandchild. He has served as a deacon at Stilwell First Baptist for 32 years. Two of his children and four grandchildren have earned certifications at Indian Capital.

Ladena Faye Coleman Oct. 31, 1977 - March 15, 2024






